Where are we now?

- **HIV/AIDS has undermined food security through loss of adult labor, illness & death, and indirectly by siphoning off productive time of other household members who care for the sick**

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What approaches are we using?

- **PVOs are critical to linking CBOs, FBOs & local governments to:**
 - **integrate HIV/AIDS funding & food aid resources**
 - **build local capacity through training and community support for care, including involvement of people living with HIV/AIDS**
 - **ensure sustainability with an entry/exit strategy**

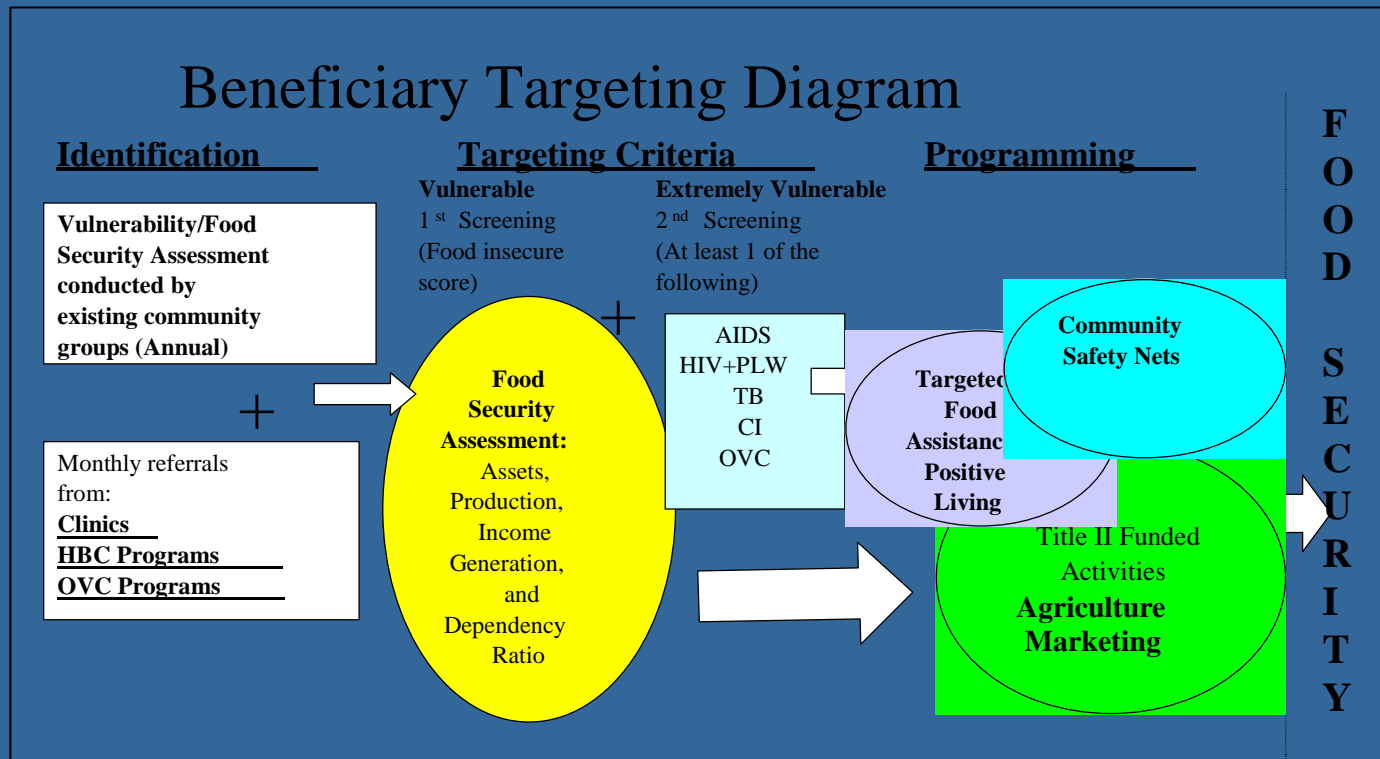
What approaches are working?

- **Food aid is critical in responding to HIV/AIDS**
 - **Reduce disease progression in those living with HIV**
 - **Increased availability of and access to micronutrient-fortified food is needed**
 - **Contribute to post-partum nutrition and improve health of mothers & children born to HIV+ mothers**

Successful approaches from C-SAFE Zambia

- **Alternative practices & relief mechanisms, such as food for assets and targeting criteria**
- **Inclusion of PLWHA in key decision-making processes**

What is Wrap Around Programming?

- **PEPFAR coordinates with and leverages resources from other agencies and sectors, such as nutrition and education, to promote comprehensive and effective responses.**
- **Some examples of other USG sources are USAID's Title II Program, USDA's Food for Progress program, and other sources including the UN's World Food Program and the private sector.**

Wrap Around Programming Examples

- **Interagency technical working group on food and nutrition, that is finalizing guidance on appropriate assessment, monitoring, and counseling on the nutritional needs of people living with HIV/AIDS.**
- **Holistic wrap around programming approach in Zambia that achieves successful integration of food and PEPFAR programs.**

How can we work together better?

To reach the President's Emergency Plan (EP) goals, **FOOD SECURITY & HIV/AIDS** programs must be integrated

- Incorporate appropriate food & nutrition into funding for ARV therapy
- Coordinate & design programs to meet multiple needs of HIV/AIDS affected people
- Urgently address the impact of HIV/AIDS on OVC, particularly in southern Africa, in a way that is commensurate with the need

How can we work together better?

- **Targeting - focus food aid for the *most vulnerable*, not solely for PLWHA**
- **Offer long-term funding commitments for sustainable practices such as home/kitchen gardens & development of community safety-net programs**

How can we work together better?

- **Additional studies and pilot programs are necessary to determine appropriate foods for diverse nutritional needs such as ARTs**
- **Common indicators needed to measure effects of improved household food technology, dietary advice, and provision of food given on nutritional recovery, disease progression and quality of life**
