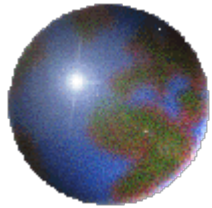




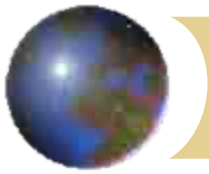

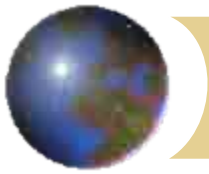

- A foundation formed to help some of the world's poorest children have access to a school meal and opportunity for an education





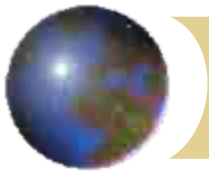
# *GCNF - A Purpose Driven Foundation*

barrier to children learning

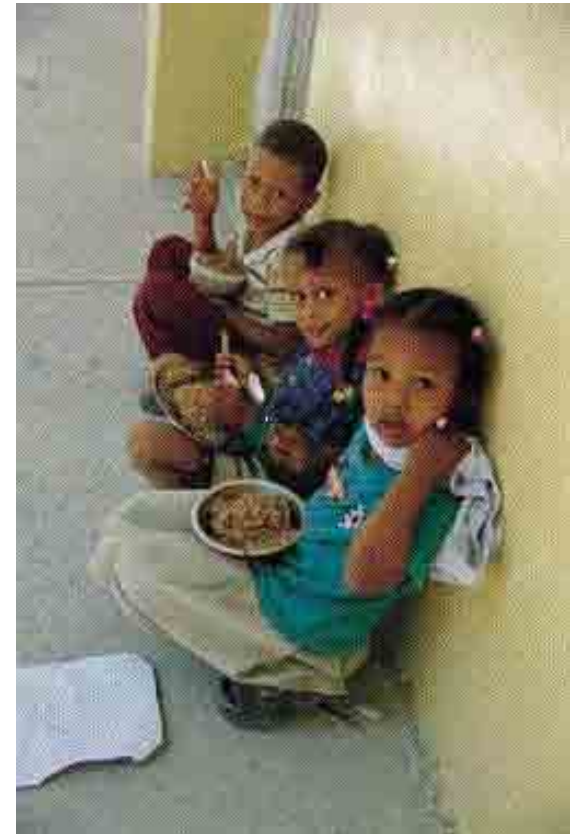

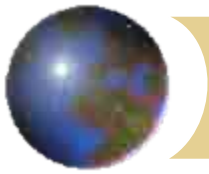

- We help governments and their country leaders develop policy and build capacity for self directed training, technical assistance, resource development and network building—all targeted to achieve sustainable school feeding programs

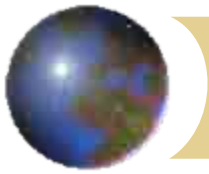




# *The Global Child Nutrition Forum*

## *A Flagship Program*

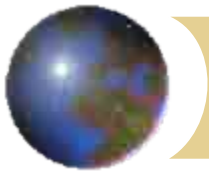
- Operating since 1997

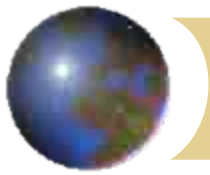

**July 11-16, 2007, Chicago, IL**

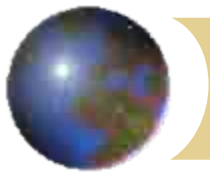
- Representatives from five target countries as well as Jamaica, Canada, Ghana, Brazil and South Africa

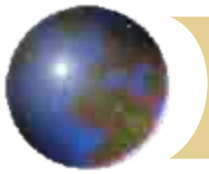




*2008 Global Child Nutrition Forum:

## *2008 Global Child Nutrition Forum (cont.)*

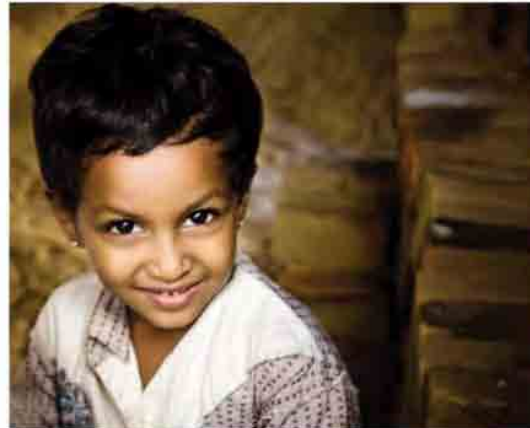

  - Ulla Holm, Tetra Pak, Sweden



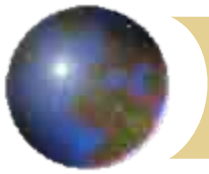

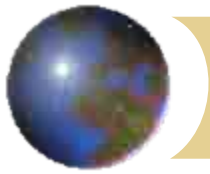


# *School Feeding Toolkit*

## **Objectives:**

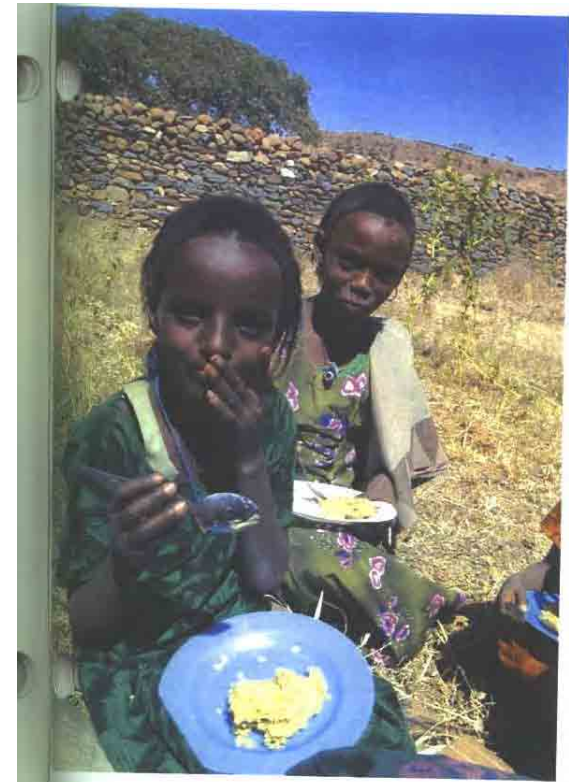
- To develop a country plan for a sustainable school feeding program,

- To establish national and international school feeding networks.

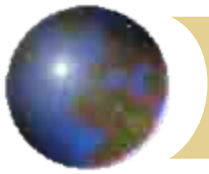

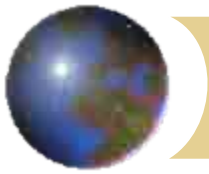
# GCNF Country Planning Process for Sustainable School Feeding Programs





## *Delegate Responsibilities*

- Make a personal commitment to provide leadership for the country plan,
- Ensure there is an individual to oversee or manage the plan's implementation,
- Maintain steady "ownership" of plan,
- Commit personally to promoting the plan,
- Participate in an international school feeding network, and
