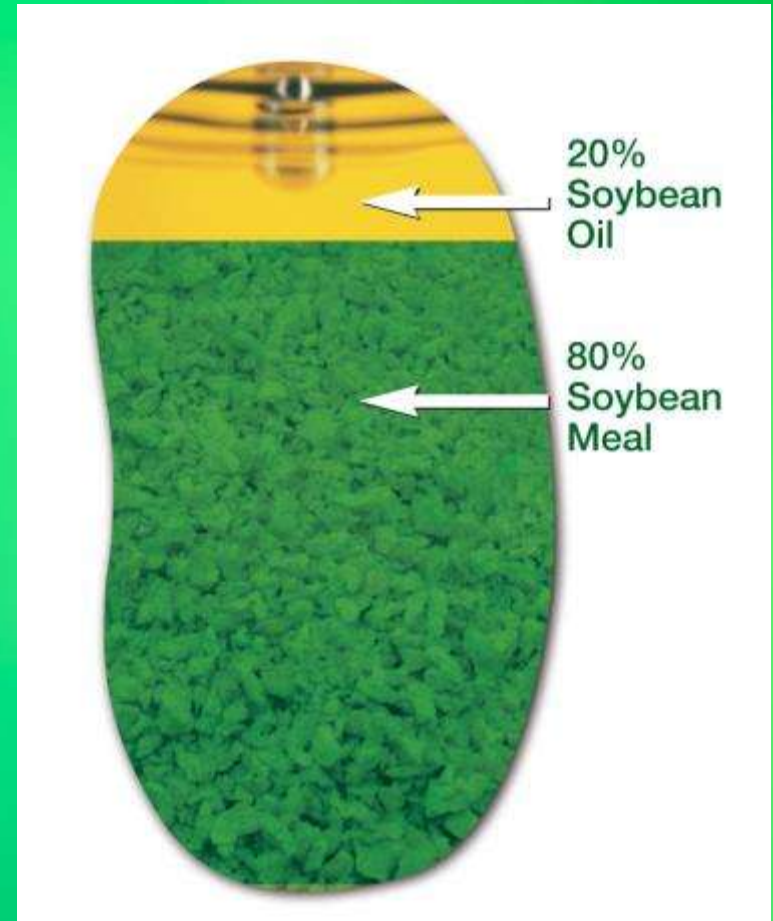

Biodiesel Benefits the Food Supply, Energy Security, Environment & Economy



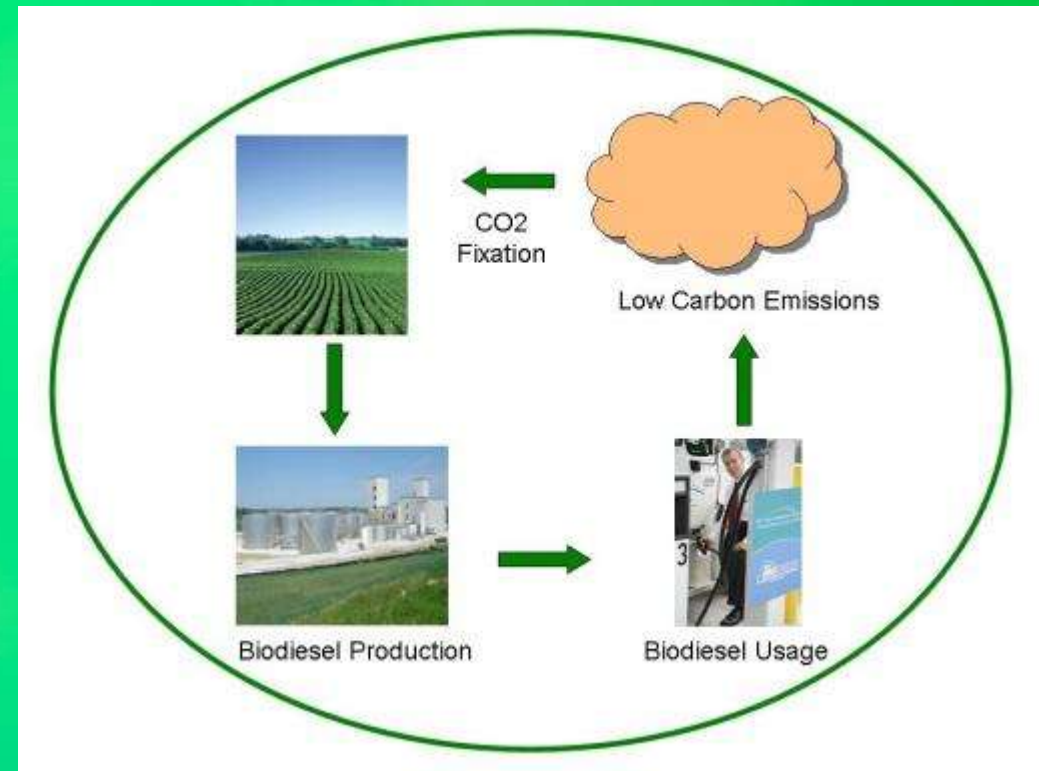
2008 U.S. Biodiesel Production

Biodiesel from Soy is a net positive to the food supply and the environment.



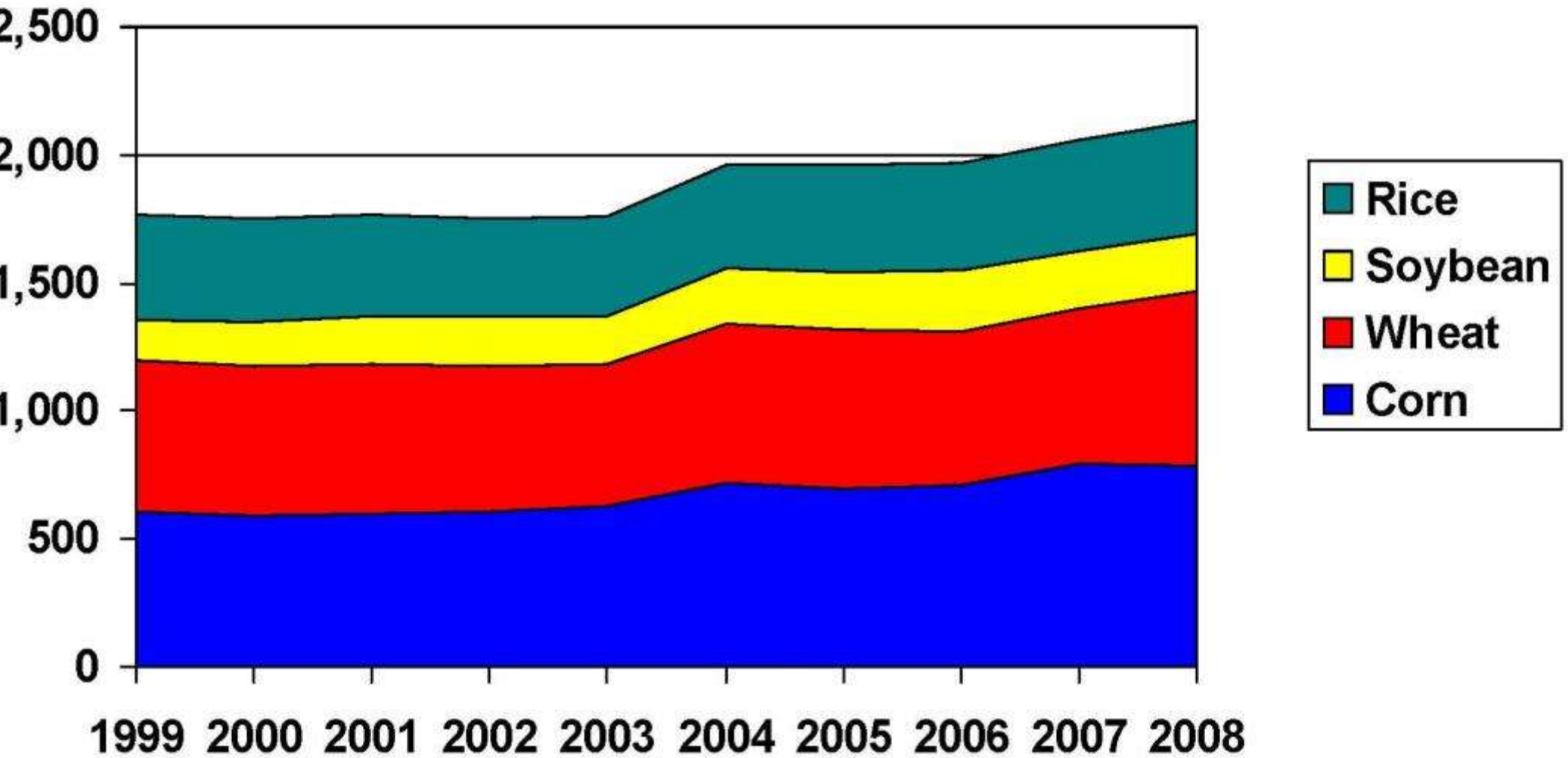
Record Soybean Plantings Projected for 2009

Global Wheat, Rice, and Soybean Production Increased in 2008...





Kraft Foods profit more than doubles Post cereals sale, price increases help profit gain

SAN FRANCISCO (MarketWatch) – Kraft Foods Inc., one of the world's largest food makers, said Wednesday that third-quarter net income more than doubled after exiting the Post cereal business as well as being helped by product-price increases and cost cuts.

Kraft (KFT: **23.51, -0.82, -3.4%**) earned \$1.4 billion, or 93 cents a share, in the third quarter compared to \$596 million, or 38 cents a share, in last year's same period. The profit included a gain of 57 cents a share from selling the 24 Post cereal brands to Ralcorp (RAH: **60.91, -1.12, -1.8%**) for \$1.7 billion in stock.

On that basis and excluding a restructuring charge, Kraft said it earned 44 cents a share, in line with Wall Street's expectations, according to analysts polled by FactSet Research.

Sales rose 19% to \$10.5 billion, edging past what analysts had forecasted.

Biodiesel IS Helping Feed and Fuel the World

The U.S. biodiesel made from soybean oil alone in 2008 co-produced enough soybean meal to yield the equivalent of 115 billion rations of high-protein soy, such as those already being used in WISHH-supported nutrition programs.

EPA's Unreasonable ILUC Assumptions Threaten RFS-2

EPA proposed a rule that will not allow any domestic feedstocks from vegetable oil

- Assumes that 50% of the direct carbon benefits will be offset, despite producing more biodiesel than is called for in 2010
