

REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL FROM THE WORLD INITIATIVE FOR SOY IN HUMAN HEALTH (WISHH)

I. DATE

July 14, 2020

II. PROJECT OBJECTIVE

The purpose of this request for proposal (RFP) is to receive proposals to implement the animal feed activities funded through the United States Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Emerging Markets Program (EMP). These activities include overseeing two feeding demonstrations (one poultry and one swine), organize two farmer field days upon the completion of the feeding demonstrations, recruit and escort participants for a trade team to the United States, arrange the feed mill visits for two technical consultants and the ASA/WISHH Asia Division Director visit. There could be additional contracts depending on future funding levels.

III. ORGANIZATON BACKGROUND

The American Soybean Association's World Initiative for Soy in Human Health (WISHH) program connects trade and development across global market systems, improving food security. Knowing that protein plays an essential role in human nutrition, visionary U.S. soybean growers founded WISHH in 2000 to serve as a catalyst in emerging markets. IV. SCOPE OF WORK

The selected firm or individual will be contracted to implement the following activities under the direction of the ASA/WISHH Asia Division Director. The activities and estimated number of days per activity are below:

Organize and escort the two feed mill technical consultant visits	24 days
Progress reports and communication with St. Louis	11 days
Asia Division Director visit	10 days
Feed demonstrations and farmer field days	27 days
Trade team recruitment	12 days

VII. INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

- 1. Proposals are due on July 31, 2020. The proposal must answer the questions in Appendix A.
- 2. Expenses for travel within Cambodia, the feeding demonstrations and farmer field days are not to be included in your proposal. The proposal is only for your costs to implement the activities. Travel will be reimbursed on actual costs.

Proposals should be submitted no later than 4:00 PM CDT on Friday, July 31st, 2020. To be considered for award, proposals must be submitted by e-mail to the following: Alan F. ASA/WISHH will consider proposals with a maximum budget no greater than \$30,240. Reimbursable in-country travel costs up to \$4,312 and are not included in the \$30,240 amount. No further funds will be allocated to the firm to implement the required activities or travel costs.

The ASA/WISHH reserves the right to negotiate and award only a portion of the requirements; to negotiate and award separate or multiple contracts for the elements covered by this RFP in any combination it may deem appropriate, at its sole discretion to add new considerations, information or requirements at any stage of the procurement process, including during negotiations with vendors; and reject proposal of any vendor that has previously failed to perform properly or in a timely manner contracts of a similar nature, or of a vendor that, in the opinion of the ASA/WISHH, is not in a position, or is not sufficiently qualified, to perform the contract.

This RFP contains no contractual proposal of any kind, any proposal submitted will be regarded as a proposal by the vendor and not as an acceptance by the vendor of any proposal by the ASA/WISHH. No contractual relationship will exist except pursuant to a written contract document signed by the authorized procurement official of the ASA/WISHH and by the successful vendor(s) chosen by the ASA/WISHH.
