ASA/WISHH Take Action for Global Food Security Dialogue

February 6-7, 2025 | Antigua, Guatemala











Introduction

ASA/WISHH convened its third global food security dialogue on February 6-7, 2025. The Take Action for Guatemala Global Food Security Dialogue was an unprecedented in-country WISHH program, building on WISHH's two decades of collaboration with Guatemala's leaders for food security. An evening welcome reception on February 6 featured Minister of Agriculture, Livestock and Food Maynor Estrada who set the tone of food security's significance in the country where soy is widely accepted as a healthy protein source in a wide range of popular foods and beverages. The next morning, Deputy Director-General at the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) of the United Nations Beth Bechdol was the keynote speaker with a virtual presentation from Rome. She described the global trends and challenges for food security as well as why agrifood system transformation is part of the solution to ensure food security and good nutrition.

More than 100 Dialogue participants brought their unique perspectives from their diverse roles ranging from executives of local organizations and food companies to U.S. soybean farmers to leaders of international organizations. They shared the many ways soy protein already benefits food security in the country as well as insights on the potential for greater collaboration. As a keynote speaker posed, "How do we think differently to make progress?"

The Dialogue set the stage for discussion and decisions and sharing of past successes. Attendees listened and learned from one another on topics ranging from trade-building relationships to innovation centers, new product development, supply chains, and importantly, partnerships between local organizations as well as the public and private sectors. Together, they committed to further collaborate to cultivate even more opportunities for soy to serve as a solution in Guatemala's food security.
